Succession	When a propertied individual, or spouse, dies, heirs (forced and collateral) have legal rights to the property of the decedent. In order to lawfully divide the property among all heirs, the "estate" of the deceased person must be administered through attorneys and estate executors in a long, and complex legal process. The entire process of administering the estate is commonly referred to as "succession."
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## G. Geographic Terms

### Attakapas District and Post

As a trading post, there is evidence that Louis JUCHEREAU de Saint-Denys, military commandant of the Natchitoches District and Post, established a trading post at what is now St. Martinville between 1722 and 1744. There, he placed a merchant to trade with the local Attakapas Indians. And thus the trading post became known as Le Poste-des-Attakapas, with St. Martinville being its administrative seat. In 1765, the post became a military district presided over by a military commandant, the first being the French-born Gabriel FUSELIER de la Claire.<sup>1</sup>

### Opelousas District and Post

Shares a similar history with the Attakapas Post. The Natchitoches commandant JUCHEREAU de Saint-Denys established a trading post with the Opelousas Indians at the same time as with the Attakapas. Thus, the administrative seat and name of the post was for the Opelousas Indians. In 1763, Louis Gérard PELLERIN, a Frenchman served as the post's first appointed military commandant, and the post became the Opelousas District.<sup>2</sup>



Alexandre François Joseph DE CLOUET de Piettre, also known as Alexandre Chevalier DE CLOUET, was born c. 1725 in Picardie, France to Jean-Martin DE CLOUET de Piettre and to Laure BAUME de Gambier. He married 11 May 1761 Marie-Louise DE FAVROT, sometimes FAVEROT, Cr  ole of New Orleans, daughter of Claude Joseph Fran  ois DE FAVROT and of Louise Elisabeth BRUSL   (SLC).

He served as Commandant of the Opelousas and Attakapas Military Posts and Districts.

Alexandre Le Chevalier DE CLOUET died 30 Jul 1789 in New Orleans. Inventory dated 5 Sept 1789 (SM Cth OA v 7 #98).

Louise DE FAVROT died 25 Dec 1814 at age 74 (SM Ch v 4 #936).

He married Magdeleine Victoire PETIT de Livillier, daughter of Charles PETTIT de Livillier of Verteuil, Lot-et-Garonne, Aquitaine, France, and Louise Etienne DE MALBEC of Brest, Finist  re, Bretagne, France. Magdeleine's sister, Antoinette P  lagie PETIT de Livillier, married colonial Governor of French Louisiana, Etienne Martin DE NUISEMENT de Vaughn  .

Paul-Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE was a Knight of the Honorary Military Order of Saint-Louis, Major at La Place d'Armes in New Orleans, Cavalier [Chevalier] and Master Peltman [Pelletier].

Paul-Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE died 22 Nov 1777, buried same day (SM Ch v 1 p 57).

Magdeleine-Victoire PETIT de Livillier died 24 Mar 1784 at age 50 (SM Ch Folio B-1 Funeral).

He married Marie Élisabeth Sabine MONTAULT de Montbérault de Saint-Civier, *Créole* of Louisiana, daughter of Henri MONTAULT de Montbérault de Saint-Civier of Polaminy, France, and to Françoise Laurence LE BLANC of Bassuet, France.

<sup>vi</sup> **St-Marc DARBY**

Jean-Baptiste St-Marc DARBY, also Jean-Baptiste DARBY or St-Marc DARBY, *Créole* of New Orleans, was born 29 March 1745 to Peter Jonathan DARBY, also known as Pierre DARBY, of Semmingson, England and to Anne Marie Hélène BACHEMIN de Corbin, native of France, all residents of New Orleans. He married Françoise Hélène Louise PELLERIN, *Créole* of New Orleans, daughter of Louis Gérard PELLERIN and of Françoise Alexandra VIEL or VIELLE, both *Créoles* of New Orleans.

St-Marc DARBY died 13 July 1795, age 50, in the Attakapas District (SM Ch v 4 #83).

He married 5 May 1859 Marie Henriette DE CLOUET – griffonne libre, daughter of Augustin DE CLOUET and Magdeleine BENO  T – both gens de couleur libres (SM Ch v 9 #268).

<sup>xv</sup> **Francisque**

10 February 1792 "Francisque" listed in the slave inventory for the estate of Jean-Baptiste BENO  T de Sainte-Claire in St. Martinville, age 28. Valued at 600 pesos.

17 October 1794 St. Martinville – Francisque, 25 year old *mul  tre*, listed in mention of DECLOUET slaves, which the widow (Marie-Louise DE FAVROT) wished to keep for herself instead of donation to her children (SM Cth Original Acts B15 #467).

12 December 1808 St. Martinville – Louise DE FAVROT, widow of Alexandre Joseph DE CLOUET, sells a 40 year old slave named Francisque to her son Alexandre DE CLOUET, for the price of \$900 (SM Cth v 24 #23).

1814 St. Martinville – Louise DE FAVROT, widow of Alexandre Joseph DECLOUET, manumits Francisque, age 40, mul  tre (Conrad v 2 pt 1 p 164).

Francisque DE CLOUET - mul  tre libre married 23 May 1846 Marie-Anne "Nanette" MASSE - n  gresse libre, daughter of Pierre MASSE and Lisette MASSE - gens de couleur libres (SM Ch v 8 #294). He died 23 October 1850 at St. Martinville, age 90 (SM Ch v 5 p 198).

1794 St. Martinville – Louise DE FAVROT, widow of Alexandre Joseph DE CLOUET, in the presence of the mistress, her adult children and civil officials, emancipates a mulâtre named Jeanne.

<sup>xvi</sup> **Jolivet**

23 September 1791 St. Martinville – Louise DE FAVROT, widow of Alexandre Joseph DE CLOUET, sells a 14 year old mulâtre named Jolivet, to her son, Louis DE CLOUET, for the price of \$1,200 (Hall Database Line 28926).

27 Nov 1817 François BENOÎT de Sainte-Claire, in consideration of good conduct and faithful services manumitted his mulatto slave Jolivet for good conduct and faithful service (Conrad, *Attakapas Doomsday*, v 2 pt 1 p 294).

He fathered children with Marguerite RENÉ - mulâtre affranchie from Réné TRAHAN, daughter of TRAHAN's slave Vénus - nègresse affranchie. Father may be Réné TRAHAN.

15 September 1777 St. Martinville – Listed in the inventory of slaves belonging to Paul DE LA HOUSSAYE: Lindor, age 6, "mulatto rouge," valued at 450 pesos; enumerated with sister Estère, age 8, also "mulatto rouge," and mother Françoise, age 45, nègresse (SM Cth B1 Roll1 #139).

3 August 1784 St. Martinville – Lindor, 16, nègre, shoemaker, enumerated in a slave inventory for the DE LA HOUSSAYE family. Valued at 600 pesos (SM Cth Original Acts B4 #64).

<sup>xxiii</sup> **Isidore**

14 September 1815 St. Martinville – Isidore, 35, mulâtre, valued at \$1,000, was inventoried in the succession of

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his deceased master, Jean Louis Augustin "Louis" DE LA HOUSSAYE (SM Cth Conveyances 1A #2769).

Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE died 15 September 1814, age 55, in St. Martinville (SM Ch v 4 #915).

Isidore died 29 Nov 1830 at age 62 *chez lui* in St. Martinville, interred following day in parish cemetery (SM Ch v 4 #2096).

<sup>xxiv</sup> **Sorlingue, Thérèse**

On 6 February 1758, in New Orleans, Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE purchased a slave family from the estate of Sieur LOQUET de la Pommeraye, recently deceased, the former Treasurer-General of the French colony of Louisiana. The consisted of Sorlingue or Sorlingues, Térèse [Thérèse] - his wife, and their 4 children: Nicolas, Louis, Pierre and Zaïre. Payment: 7,500 piastres (Midlo Hall Slave Database Estate Number 03-F-132-070-1758).

"Une nègre nommée Sorlingue, prèsqu'aveugle, agé d'environ soixante et dix ans. Et une négresse nommée Thérèse, agée d'environ cinquante ans; mariée avec le dit Sorlingue en face d'église. Estimés cent soixante piastres - 160" (1778 Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE, p 19, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

<sup>xxv</sup> **Françoise, Lindor, Estère**

"Une négresse nommée Françoise agée d'environ quarante cinq ans; hypothéquée d'une part avec ses enfants nommés Lindor de six ans et d'une petite fille nommée Estère agée de trois ans estimés quatre cents cinquante piastres - 450" (1778 Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE, p 17, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

"Une mulâtre domestique nommée Vénus agée d'environ vingt quatre ans estimée trois cents cinquante piastres - 350" (1778 Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE, p 18, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

1789 New Orleans – Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE emancipated Vénus, age 35, for good services and 600 *cuiños mexicanos* (Mexican silver) (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 1305).

"Une nègritte appelée Rosette agée d'environ onze ans estimée deux cents vingt piastres - 220" (Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE, p 18, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

<sup>xxviii</sup> **Jeanne**

"Une négresse nommée Jeanne agée d'environ trente six ans estimée deux cents cinquante piastres - 250" (1778 Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE p 19, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

<sup>xxix</sup> **Zaïre, Valer, Isidore**

Her entire name was Marguerite Orté Zaïre DE LA HOUSSAYE.

1811 St. Martinville – Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE emancipated Magdeleine, a 50 year old *négresse* (Conrad v 2 pt 1 p 125).

"Une négresse nommée Charlotte agée d'environ treize ans estimée deux cents quarante - 240" (1778 Inventory of Paul Augustin DE LA HOUSSAYE p 19, SM Cth Conveyances #s 4, 5).

<sup>xxxiii</sup> **Thomas**

1785 New Orleans – Gabriel FUSÉLIER de la Claire and his wife, Hélène SOILEAU, emancipated a 70 year old *nègre* slave named Thomas for various particular deeds and services for 60 pesos (Midlo Hall Free Database 1038).

<sup>xxxiv</sup> **Stix**

1780 St. Martinville – Gabriel FUSÉLIER de la Claire emancipated Stix, a 50 year old *nègre* as the master and his wife were satisfied with services (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 659).

<sup>xxxv</sup> **Louis**

1785 St. Martinville – Jean-François LÉDÉE emancipated Louis, mulâtre (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 1048).

"Marriage Contracts, Wills & Testaments of the Spanish Colonial Period in New Orleans, 1770-1804" transcr. by Charles R. MADUELLE Jr., the following under wills & testaments: Juan Francisco LEDE, Mar. 11, 1785, Fernando Rodriguez (Notary), volume 4, page 2176.

1785, Last Will and Testament of Jean-François LÉDÉE (SM Cthse Original Acts v 46 #67) states the following:

Item 22

I give to my mulatto named Louis his liberty without any restrictions after my death in recognition of his faithful service since childhood.

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Item 23      In virtue of his freedom, I intend that Louis buy and free his five children by my negress Thérèse (35), to whit: Louison (10), Françoise (7), Thérèze (6), Jean-François (4), and Marinette (2).

Louis is to receive 2,000 pesos.

Item 24      I want Louis to buy my negress slave Françoise.

1785, Solomon MALINES, executor of the will of François LÉDÉE manumitted Louis for good and faithful services (SM Cthse Original Acts v 4 #92).

4 May 1796 Louis LÉDÉE declared that he received from Ignácio FERNÁNDEZ Y VALESCO the sum of 234 pesos which FERNÁNDEZ loaned him from the estate of François LÉDÉE for the purpose of buying the liberty of his wife and children. LÉDÉE promised to repay the sum at the end of 1796. Louis DE CLOUET acted as surety for LÉDÉE (SM Cthse Original Acts v 18 #4).

7 Sept 1815 Balthazard and Gustave DE LA HOUSSAYE sold to Louis LÉDÉE a mulatto named Henry (3) and a mulatto girl (10 months). Price: 300 piastres (Conrad, Conveyances Records of the Attakapas Country, vol 2 pt 1).

28 Aug 1819 Balthasar DE LA HOUSSAYE sold to Louis LÉDÉ - de couleur libre, Alexandre, age 3, a négrillon for 400 piastres (SM Cthse Original Acts v 33 #3932).

1st Will and Testament dated 27 Aug 1814 (SM Cthse Succession #163 \*missing from Courthouse). Succession dated 1 Jul 1834 (Second Will and Testament included: SM Cthse Succession #759).

Louis LÉDÉ - mulâtre affranchi, fathered the following 5 children with Thérèse - négresse also belonging to Jean-François LÉDÉE:

- (1)    Louison LÉDÉ - griffonne who bore children for Louis MASSE - de couleur libre, also known as Louis BONNET or BONIN
- (2)    Françoise Louise "La petite" LÉDÉ - griffe who bore children for Joseph ORSO
- (3)    Thérèse - griffe
- (4)    Jean-François - griffe
- (5)    Marinette LÉDÉ - griffonne who bore children for Sebastián CASTEYO or CASTILLO, a native of Mallorca, Spain, for Alexandre dit Célestin GRÉVEMBERG - quarteron libre, and for an Unknown DE LA HOUSSAYE.

Louis LÉDÉ - mulâtre affranchi, fathered the following 4 children with Clémence DE LA HOUSSAYE:

- (1)    Jean LÉDÉ – griffe affranchi was born c. 1807, baptized in 1814 (SM Ch Baptêmes de couleur #540). He married 11 Feb 1840 Louise Armantine ORSO – de couleur libre, daughter of Joseph ORSO and Françoise Louise LÉDÉ – gens de couleur libres (SM Ch v 8 #157).
- (2)    Henri LÉDÉ – mulâtre affranchi was born c. 1813, baptized in 1818 (SM Ch Baptêmes de couleur #668). He married 30 Nov 1836 Marie Adèle BOUTTÉ – mulâtresse libre de la Côte-aux-Puces on Bayou Têche, daughter of Pierre BOUTTÉ and Marie-Antoinette – both mulâtres libres (SM Ch v 8 #32).
- (3)    Marie Cécile LÉDÉ – mulâtresse affranchie was born c. 1815, baptized in 1818 (SM

Ch Baptêmes de couleur #669). She married 5 Feb 1840 Pierre LAVIOLETTE – mulâtre libre native of New Orleans, veuf Marie Arthémise CARRIÈRE, son of Pierre LAVIOLETTE and Françoise BEAUMONT LIVAUDAIS – nègresse libre (SM Ch v 8 #156).

- (4) Narcisse Julien LÉDÉ – griffe affranchi was born c. 1822. He married 5 Dec 1845 Félicité DARBY – mulâtresse libre, daughter of Charles DARBY and Félicité dite Prudence BOUTTÉ – both mulâtres libres de la Côte-aux-Puces (Franklin Cthse marriage v 3 #408). He fathered children with Thérèse OLIVIER, MARINETTE, Félicité m. Julien MARINETTE d. 2 Jan 1858 at age 35 (NI Ch v 1 p 55).

#### <sup>xxxvi</sup> Thérèse

1787 St. Martinville – Louis GRÉVEMBERT, satisfied with services and fidelity gives conditional freedom to Thérèse, age 30, provided that she serves him with the same zeal until he dies (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 1206).

#### <sup>xxxvii</sup> Marie

1782 Pointe-Coupée – Sieur DUCRÊT of the Attakapas manumits a slave named Marie, age 40, who pays for her own freedom for the sum of 350 pesos (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 832).

#### <sup>xxxviii</sup> Françoise

Françoise - nègresse bore 1 son for Philippe WISSE [WILTZ] named Philippe "Petit" WILTZ, husband of Caroline-Hortance FONTENETTE - *mulâtresse affranchie*. Later, Françoise became the consort of Joseph WISSE [WILTZ], Philippe's brother, a batchelor, and bore him 6 natural children:

- (1) Francisca [Françoise] WILTZ – *mulata esclava* a Louis-Armand DUCREST, was baptized 24 Nov 1774. Baptismal sponsors were Baptiste LALONDE and Marie-Rose DOZAT (SM Ch v 1 p 43).
- (2) Marcelo [Marcel] WILTZ – *mulato esclavo* a Louis-Armand DUCREST, was baptized 7 Jul 1778. Baptismal sponsors were Francisco [François] GRÉVEMBERG and Catherine WILS [sic] – master's spouse (SM Ch v 1 p 63). He fathered children with Adèle - esclave.
- (3) Moisés [Moïse] WILTZ – *mulato esclavo* de Louis-Armand DUCREST, was born 15 Sept 1780, baptized 2 Feb 1789. Baptismal sponsors were Juan Luis [Jean-Louis] – *negro esclavo* and María Teresa [Marie-Thérèse] (SM Ch v 1s #50). He died 8 Jan 1828 at about 51 years old *chez lui à l'île-des-Cyprès*, at his place on Cypress Island, buried the following day in parish cemetery (SM Ch v 4 #1886).
- (4) Joseph Nazaire WILTZ – *mulâtre affranchi*, was born c. 1782. He fathered children with Marie.
- (5) Charles WILTZ – *mulâtre esclave* was born c. 1785. He fathered children with Rose VEILLON - *esclave à Louis VEILLON, fils*.
- (6) Julianne WILTZ – *grifa esclava* de Louis-Armand DUCREST, was born in 1789, baptized 2 Feb 1789. Baptismal sponsors were Marcelo [Marcel] and Mariana Francisca [Marianne Françoise] (SM Ch v 1s #52). She bore children for Élie LUCULLUS of France.

5 April 1793 St. Martinville – Joseph WISSE purchased from Louis-Armand DUCREST and his wife, Catherine WISSE, the following slaves: Françoise (38), Moïse (9), Philippe (7), Julie (5), Charles (3), Naserre (2) for 3,000 pesos (Midlo Hall Slave Database Lines 30630-35).

1794 St. Martinville – Joseph SWISSE [sic] emancipates the *nègresse* Françoise (40), whom SWISSE had purchased from Armand DUCREST on 4 April 1793 (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 1824).

<sup>xxxix</sup> **Thérèse**

She bore a daughter, Ursules GRÉVEMBERG - mulâtre, for an unknown GRÉVEMBERG.

Ursules GRÉVEMBERG – mulâtre esclave was born 22 Nov 1780, baptized 22 Sept 1782. Baptismal sponsors were François GRÈVEMBERG and Anna SUZ (SM Ch v 2 #66). Ursules bore children for Louis SUFFIER of Paris, France.

1806 St. Martinville – Louis SUFFIER purchased from Catherine WISSE DUCREST, a 1 month old *quarteron* for the purpose of manumitting the child (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 2970).

1808 St. Martinville – Catherine WISE DUCREST sold to Louis SUFFIER an unnamed slave (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 3167).

Ursules GRÉVEMBERG died 23 Jan 1877, age 110 [she was actually 93] (NI Ch v 2 p 83).

Freed by act dated 16 May 1808.

<sup>xl</sup> **Alexandre**

1818 St. Martinville – François ST-MARC DARBY gave freedom to Alexandre, age 42 1/2, nègre. Slave was valued at \$600 and freedom was conditional on the basis of Alexandre serving his master for 3 more years, until 1 April 1821 (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 3846).

<sup>xli</sup> **Thérèse or Teresa**

1783 New Orleans – In recognition of much love, affection and various deeds, Juan Bautista MACARTY emancipated a slave named Teresa, age 60, nègresse, who he purchased from Juan Bautista DARBY in May of 1783 (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 929).

<sup>xlii</sup> **Nanette or Naneta**

1779 New Orleans – Juan Bautista DARBY sold a slave named Naneta to Juan Bautista LAMON for 450 pesos, for the purpose of her manumission. Act of freedom granted by Juan DE LA VILLERÉ, captain of the fixed Louisiana regiment (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 565).

She became the consort of Pierre Jonathan DARBY Jr., native of New Orleans, resident of the Attakapas District, son of Peter Jonathan DARBY Sr., native of Semmingson, England, and of Anne Marie Hélène BACHEMIN de Corbin, native of France, all residents of New Orleans.

Nanette bore Pierre 4 children:

- (1) Charles DARBY – mulâtre affranchi was born c. 1786. He married 2 Dec 1816 Félicité dite Prudence BOUTTÉ – mulâtre affranchie, daughter of Pierre BOUTTÉ and Hiacinthe DE LA HOUSSAYE LAPORTE – both mulâtres libres (SM Ch v 6 #15).
- (2) Célestin DARBY – mulâtre affranchi was born c. 1787. He married 2 Dec 1816 Adèle BOUTTÉ – mulâtre libre, daughter of Philippe Philippeau BOUTTÉ and Marie-Antoinette – both mulâtres libres. Witnesses were Jean Baptiste ROCHON, Zénon OLIVIER, François FRILOT, Philippant BOUTTÉ, Ursin FRILOT (SM Ch v 6 #14).
- (3) Pierre DARBY, II – mulâtre libre was born c. 1789. He married 3 Nov 1840 Marie Françoise Louise BOUTTÉ – mulâtre libre, daughter of Philippe Philippeau BOUTTÉ and Marie-Antoinette – both mulâtres libres (Franklin Cthse marriage v 3 #163).

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- (4) Céleste “Célestine” DARBY – mulâtre libre was born c. 1792

<sup>xliii</sup> **Adélaïde**

13 August 1812 St. Martinville – François ST-MARC Darby sold to Pierre BOUTTÉ – *h.d.c.l.* a slave girl named Adèle (5 months), daughter of Adélaïde. Price \$300 (SM Cth OA Book 27 #112).

13 August 1812 St. Martinville – François ST-MARC Darby sold to Ursin Étienne DARBY a *nègresse* slave named Adélaïde, age 25 (SM Cth Original Acts v 27 #113).

7 September 1813 St. Martinville – Ursin Étienne DARBY sold to Pierre - *h.d.c.l.* a slave named Adélaïde, *nègresse*, age 36, for \$1,200 (SM Cth Original Acts v 28 #11).

1817 St. Martinville – the DE LA HOUSSAYE and DARBY families sold the following slaves to Pierre BOUTTÉ - homme de couleur libre, all his natural children with the slave Adélaïde: Pierre Jr. (20), Marcellin (19), Mélidor (18), Fanchon (17), Mulot (16), Adèle (13), Delzinde [Drozin] (12). Hall's downloaded "free" database codes all children as griffe, but in the comments section the encoder notes "Racial designation nm means unclear, not non-white, from Conrad transcription. Perhaps negro man or negro male?" Document stipulates that the children would be treated as free (*statu libre*) until age the law allows for official recognition. Pierre BOUTTÉ's two brothers to act as guardian of minor children until that point (Midlo Hall Free Database Lines 3733-3741). Pierre, Marcellin, Mélidor and Fanchon were children of Hiacinthe LAPORTE, formerly a slave of the DE LA HOUSSAYE; the remaining children belonged to Jean-Baptiste ST-MARC Darby's slave Adélaïde.

Adélaïde ST-MARC, also called Adélaïde DARBY - *nègresse libre* became one of the consorts of Pierre BOUTTÉ. She bore him 4 children:

- (1) Louis Antoine dit Mulot BOUTTÉ – griffe libre was born c. 1801 to Pierre BOUTTÉ – mulâtre libre and Adélaïde DARBY ST-MARC – *nègresse affranchie*. He fathered one son with Marie-Thérèse DAUTERIVE DUBUCLET - *nègresse esclave*. He married (1) 17 Feb 1835 Geneviève Eugénie ORSO – griffe libre of St. Martinville, daughter of Honoré ORSO – mulâtre libre and Bénédicte BÉRARD – *nègresse libre*, both formally of New Orleans (SM Ch v 7 #316). He married (2) 15 Sept 1862 Hélène “Evelina” COLLETTE – de couleur libre, daughter of Jean Baptiste COLLETTE and Marie Célestine GRÈVEMBERG – gens de couleur libres (Charenton Ch v 1 p 115).
- (2) Marie Adèle BOUTTÉ – griffe libre was born c. 1804. She married 30 Nov 1836 Henri LÉDÉ – griffe libre of St. Martinville, son of Louis LÉDÉ – mulâtre libre and Clémence – *nègresse esclave* (SM Ch v 8 #32). Succession dated 19 Jul 1894 (SM Cth Succession #2877).
- (3) Joseph Drozin BOUTTÉ – griffe libre was born 18 Aug 1814, baptized 23 Jun 1817. Baptismal sponsors were Antoine FRILOT and Marie FRILOT (SM Ch Baptêmes de couleur #625). He fathered children with Marie-Louise-Céline BOUTTÉ – mulâtre libre, daughter of Philippe Philippant BOUTTÉ – mulâtre libre and Marianne-Pélagie GRÉGOIRE – griffe sauvagesse libre.
- (4) Philippe BOUTTÉ – griffe libre was born 16 Apr 1819, baptized 6 Feb 1820. Baptismal sponsors were Philippe FRILOT and Aspasie OLIVIER (SM Ch Baptêmes de couleur #270).

<sup>xliv</sup> **Marianne**

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Marianne was the mother of two known children: (1) Jeanne, more commonly called Jeanneton, born in 1764, and of (2) Marie, born in 1766.

Jeanneton bore 6 documented children:

- (1) Claire "Clarisse" – nègresse griffe was born c. 1781. She died 22 Dec 1788 (SM Ch v 1 p 74).
- (2) Marie Manon was born c. 1783.
- (3) Jeanne "Jeanneton" was born c. 1785
- (4) Marie-Chalinette DE BLANC - griffe was born c. 1786. She bore children for (1) Joseph François OZENNE and (2) Joseph Antoine Edmond OZENNE, both natives of the Attakapas District, both sons of Jacques-François OZENNE *père* and Marguerite DÉCUIR.
- (5) Céline
- (6) Jean-Baptiste

24 December 1787 – Jeanneton - griffe, domestique (24) and 4 children: Claris (6), Manon (4), Jeanne (2), Chalinette (1), all mortgaged together in the estate of Jean LABBÉ *père* estimated value at 1,200 piastres. François DÉCUIR purchased the entire family for 2,200 piastres on 30 December 1787 (Midlo Hall Slave Database Estate Number: 12-S-018-013-1787).

8 February 1808 – 25 Slaves inventoried as part of the estate of the late François DÉCUIR: Little Jean-Louis - nègre (no age); Bernard - nègre (no age); Jeanne - nègresse (22) with daughter Clarice (1 month); Manon - nègresse (23) with children Mareline, Marcelin, Émérique, Virginie, Anaïs, Touelin (no ages for the children); Agate - nègresse (30); Chalinette - nègresse (20) with children Augustin and Joséphine (no ages); Rose (12); Hirenne (12); Jeanneton - nègresse (45), and 2 children: Céline and Jean-Baptiste inventoried in the estate of the late François DÉCUIR (Midlo Hall Estate Number: 12-A-010-025-1808). François died 6 January 1808.

12 March 1819 – Mademoiselle Marie-Clémence DÉCUIR sold to her mother, Dame Marie LABBÉ, widow François DÉCUIR, the following 17 slaves: Jeanneton - nègresse (56), her daughter Manon (no age), Manon's children Céphalide (9), Marcel (7), Joachim (3 1/2), Julienne (1 1/2); Émérique (16), also a daughter of Manon, and her son Jean-Louis (4 months); Fromine - nègresse (23) and her 4 children: Carolie (5), Fanettie (4 1/2), Palmine (3), Célestin (1); Antoine - nègre (35); Célestin - nègre (29); Jean-Louis - nègre (28); Jean-Baptiste - nègre (15 1/2). Valued at 13,220 piastres. (SM Cth Conveyances # 3773).

Marie Céphalide DUPRÉ – f.d.c.l. (Marie Manon) married 12 Oct 1833 Balthasar DÉCUIR – quarteron libre (Eugénie ARMAND – mulâtrese libre) (SM Ch v 7#258).

21 Jul 1819 St. Martinville – Louis-Charles DE BLANC and wife petitions for the freedom of Chalinette for good and faithful services (SM Cth OA v 33 #3904).

Marie (daughter of Marianne) bore 2 documented children:

- (1) Geneviève - griffe was born c. 1785.
- (2) Martin - griffe was born c. 1787.

24 December 1787 – Marie (23) with two children Geneviève (3), Martin (5). Estimated at 1,692 piastres. (Midlo Hall Slave Database Estate Number: 12-S-018-013-1787).

#### <sup>xlvi</sup> Cécile & Baptiste

She went as Marianne Cécile CHARLITTE - nègresse libre.

1778 New Orleans – For just cause, Joseph PRÉVOST dit Collet from Pointe-Coupée emancipated Cécilia, nègresse, age 45, who paid 400 pesos for self-purchase (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 533).

27 June 1813 St. Martinville – Marguerite BROUSSARD, widow of Charles DUGAS, emancipated Marianne (50) and Baptiste (32) - mulâtre (SM Cth Original Acts v 28 #13; Conrad v 2 pt 1 p 152).

Jean Baptiste COLLET – mulâtre affranchi à Charles “Charlotte” DUGAS was born in 1776 to Joseph PROVOST dit Collet and Marianne Cécile – nègresse affranchie à Charles “Charlotte” DUGAS, baptized 15 Jul 1778. Baptismal sponsors were Baptiste PROVÔT [sic] and Madeleine PROVÔT [sic] (SM Ch v 1 p 60). He married 27 Apr 1839 Marie Célestine GRÉVEMBERG – mulâtre libre, daughter of Alexandre dit Célestin GRÉVEMBERG – *quareron libre* and Marinette LÉDÉ – griffonne libre (Franklin Cthse marriage v 3 p 107)

<sup>xlviii</sup> **Jacques**

1791 St. Martinville – Satisfied with good and faithful services, Claude BOUTTÉ provided for the conditional emancipation of Jacques, *nègre*, age 45, a master blacksmith. Jacques had 2 options: be emancipated at once at the death of Claude BOUTTÉ, or to self-purchase for the price of 700 pesos (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 1491).

<sup>xlix</sup> **Claude, Hilaire, Philippe**

1784 Opelousas – Claude BOUTTÉ, satisfied with efforts, care, service and fidelity, manumitted Claude, Hilaire and Philippe, under the condition that they serve him with the same exactitude and zeal until his death, and provided that no heirs oppose the said manumission (Midlo Hall Free Database Lines 985-987).

Louis Hilaire BOUTTÉ - *mulâtre libre* died 14 Jan 1835 at age 70, a batchelor (SM Ch v 5 p 45 #4). Succession dated 28 Jul 1835 (Franklin Cth Succession #303).

Claude BOUTTÉ - *mulâtre libre* died 12 Jun 1810 at age 47, a batchelor (SM Ch v 4 p 627).

Philippe ‘Philippeau’ BOUTTÉ – married 12 May 1828 Marie-Antoinette – *mulâtre libre*, who purchased her freedom (and that of her 3 daughters) from Antoine BOUTTÉ in 1802, the daughter of Unknown and Jeanne “Jeanette” – *nègresse libre*. Witnesses were Honoré ORSO, Honoré OLIVIER, Aimé FRILOT (SM Ch v 7 #84). She died 1 Jun 1828 at age 50 (SM Ch v 4 #1905). He died 28 Oct 1838, succession dated 20 Dec 1838 (Franklin Cthse succession #387).

<sup>1</sup> **Pierre**

Pierre – *mulâtre esclave* à André Claude BOUTTÉ, son of Fanchon - *nègresse*, was born 27 Sept 1775, baptized 10 Jan 1779. Baptismal sponsors were Antoine BOUTTÉ and Agathe PAINSDEE (SM Ch v 1 p 69).

1781 St. Martinville – Satisfied with services and fidelity to his mother, the slave Fanchon, Claude BOUTTÉ emancipated a 6 year old *mulâtre* named Pierre (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 689).

He fathered children with (1) Hiacinthe LA PORTE-DE LA HOUSSAYE – *mulâtre* whom he purchased from the estate of Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE and emancipated himself along with their natural children, daughter of Joseph LA PORTE of France and Éloïse DE LA HOUSSAYE –à Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE. He fathered with (2) Adélaïde ST-MARC DARBY – *nègresse* whom he purchased from Jean-Baptiste ST-MARC Darby, and emancipated along with their natural children. Last will and succession dated 22 Jan 1817, succession dated 14 Nov 1826 (Franklin Cthse succession #152).

<sup>li</sup> **Fanchon, Claude, Hilaire, Pierre, Philippe, Rose**

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1782 St. Martinville – Satisfied with services and fidelity, and at a price of 300 pesos, Claude BOUTTÉ provided emancipation to Fanchon, *nègresse*, age 50, under the condition that Fanchon promised to be as faithful and caring to BOUTTÉ as when she was his slave (Midlo Hall Free Database Line 811).

Fanchon is the mother of (1) Claude (2) Hilaire (3) Pierre (4) Philippe and (5) Rose, all *mulâtres* and natural children of André-Claude BOUTTÉ and Fanchon.

Rose "Rosette" BOUTTÉ - *mulâtre libre* became the consort of Claude FRILOT *dit* St-Éloi of New Orleans, son of Michel FRILOUX *dit* St-Éloi of France and Marie FOUCHER of France.

<sup>lxi</sup> **Étienne-Robert DE LA MORANDIER**

He married 11 June 1758 Marianne SOILEAU, daughter of Noël SOILEAU père - Royal Warehouse Guard, and of Marie-Josèphe RICHAUME (PC Ch). De la Morandier later served as Captain in the Militia of the Opelousas Post and District, Lieutenant in the French army, participated in the siege of Mobile and of Natchez in 1781. Finally, Étienne served as the last Commandant of the Avoyelles Post (Corinne L. Saucier, *History of Avoyelles Parish, Louisiana* (Gretna, La: Pelican Publishing, 1943), 34).

<sup>lxxi</sup> **François LEMELLE, III**

François LEMELLE, III, native of New Orleans, son of François LEMELLE fils *dit* Bellegarde of France and Marie-Louise MARIETTE of Germany married Charlotte Julie LABBÉ, native of New Orleans, daughter of Jean LABBÉ, of Montmorency, Québec, and of Christine ALLARD, Crôle of New Orleans (SLC).

<sup>liv</sup> **Noël SOILEAU**

Noël SOILEAU père was born 22 May 1700 at Mézières, now called Charleville-Mézières, France, to Jean-Baptiste SOILEAU and Élisabeth PELLERIN. He travelled to French Louisiana on board *Le Comte de Toulouse* on 15 November 1718 with his uncle Gérard PELLERIN. In 1726 he married Marie BORDEAUX and in 1737 Marie-Josèphe RICHAUME, widow of Barthélémy BIMOT. In the colonial censuses of 1722 and 1726, Noël appears at the Natchez Post. He later was appointed Warehouse Guard in the Service of the King of France or "Quartermaster."

Donato BELLO, a native of Napoli, Italy, was born in 1740 to Vittorio BELLO and Maria DELLA MARA. He married 15 Jan 1765 Susanne MOREAU in New Orleans, a Creole native to Mobile, daughter of Joseph Valentin MOREAU and of Marie-Jeanne LAFLEUR.

<sup>lvi</sup> **Jean DE VIDRINE**

Jean Pierre Baptiste LAPAIS de Vidrine was born 17 May 1712 in France and died 15 Jan 1788 in Louisiana. He married 15 October 1758, at Fort-Chartres, Kaskaskia, Illinois, Élizabeth TISSERAND de Montchervaux, native of Fort-Chartres, daughter of Jean-François TISSERAND de Montchervaux and of Marie Agnès CHASSON.

<sup>lvii</sup> **Jacques PATIN**

Jacques PATIN was born in 1726 at Pointe-Coupée to Antoine PATIN of France and of Marie GASPARD de Monette, Crôle of Bayougoula. He married 2 October 1761 Marie-Louise BARRÉ, Crôle of New Orleans, daughter of Paul BARRÉ and of Marie-Jeanne GIRARDY (SLC).

<sup>lviii</sup> **Joseph CARRIÈRE**

Joseph Jacques CARRIÈRE was born in Mobile in 1722 to Joseph CARRIÈRE and to Marguerite TRÉPAGNIER. He married Marie-Louise LAVERGNE, *Créole* of New Orleans, daughter of Louis LAVERGNE and Élisabeth TOMMELIN.

<sup>lix</sup> **Pierre CLERMONT**

Pierre CLERMONT married 19 September 1767 Marie-Anne DE MONCHERVAUX, *Créole* of Louisiana, daughter of Jean DE MONCHERVAUX of France and of Marie-Agnès DU CHAISSON, native of Kaskaskia, Illinois (Avoyelles Ch).

<sup>lx</sup> **Jean DE GRADENIGO**

He was born Gian DI GRADENIGO in Venezia, Veneto, Italia on c. 1735. A merchant, he moved to colonial Mobile, where on 17 March 1766 he married Marguerite KREBS, *Créole* of Mobile, daughter of Hugo Ernestus René KREBS and Marie-Josèphe SIMON *dit* Lapointe (Mobile Ch 49a, 1).

<sup>lxi</sup> **Antoine BOISDORÉ**

Antoine BOISDORÉ, *Créole*, was born 23 July 1729 in New Orleans to Joseph BARBEAU *dit* Boisdoré and to Marie BRET or BREITE (SLC). He married 22 March 1762 Marie-Françoise VEILLON, *Créole* of New Orleans, daughter of Jean-Baptiste VEILLON and Marie-Françoise AUBERT (SLC).

<sup>lxii</sup> **Barthélemy LEBLEU**

Barthélemy Blaise LEBLEU, son of Louis LEBLEU *fil*s and of Marie GENTIS, married 16 October 1769 Marie Josèphe DE LA MIRANDE, native of La Conception Immaculée Parish, Kaskaskia, Illinois, daughter of Joseph DE LA MIRANDE and Hipolita CHAUVIN de la Frénierie (Opel Ch).

<sup>lxiii</sup> **Anne, veuve QUINTREE**

Anne Marie, widow of Jean LE KINTÉREK, residents at the Côte-des-Allemands, St. Charles Parish.

<sup>lxiv</sup> There are 2 identifiable families in this slaveholding. One, Esprit (45) and Magdeleine (30), parents of François (20), Rosalie (18), Marie (10). Marie became the consort of Georges SIMIEN of France and used both ESPRIT and LEMELLE as surnames. François fathered a daughter named Céleste who went under Théotiste ESPRIT or LEMELLE, who married Baptiste MALVEAUX, the freed *nègre* son of Catherine MALVEAUX, freed *nègresse*.

The second family is Eléonore (18), *mulâtre* and her *mulâtre* son Bertrand. She also had a daughter named Victoire and a son named Alexandre, who both were referred to as *quarterons libres*, all of whom relocated to St. Martinville after emancipation with a residence in New Orleans. Victoire bore one daughter for Francisco CASO Y LUENGO, Commandant of the Attakapas Post in 1790. Alexandre LEMELLE was in a long-term relationship with Modeste LAPORTE, a *mulâtre* freed from Louis DE LA HOUSSAYE's estate, daughter of Éloïse DE LA HOUSSAYE, *griffe* slave.
